- Professor Nandasena Rathnapala, born in the remote village of Kurukude in Bandarawela, made remarkable contributions to Sinhala literature, sociology, folklore, anthropology, and criminology. He began his education at Kurukude Primary School and continued at St. John College, Panadura, following his success in the Year Five Scholarship examination. Later, he attended Royal College, Colombo, where he studied alongside notable contemporaries such as Norman Weerasooriya, Singaruwele, and Lalith Athulathmudali. Rathnapala's academic journey led him to Peradeniya University in 1955.
- ② In 1959, Rathnapala graduated with a Special Degree, Second-Class Upper Division, and was immediately recruited as a Sinhala Lecturer to the University of Peradeniya. - advantage of many opportunities such as assignment writing and lesson planning. ChatGPT can create scenarios and problems that require problem solving and creative thinking skills. Also, it can engage students in discussions on different topics, helping them to express their viewpoints. ChatGPT can simulate conversations in different languages, helping students practise speaking and comprehension. Therefore, Kevin Roose, a technology columnist for The New York Times pointed out that schools need to prepare students for a future filled with all kinds of AI tools including ChatGPT. He argued that schools should thoughtfully embrace ChatGPT as a teaching aid-one that could unlock student creativity, and better prepare students for lifelong independent learning.
- ② Despite its advanced capabilities, <u>ChatGPT is not without disadvantages</u>. According to Noam Chomsky, a pioneering linguist and a keen observer of societal trends, AI is a "plagiarism software because it doesn't create anything but copies existing works of existing artists modifying them enough to escape copyright laws." Chomsky's criticism of artificial intelligence arises from a broader concern regarding the originality and ethical implications of AI-generated content. ChatGPT also allows cheating on exams and homework, which puts students' critical thinking and analytical skills at risk.
- Although ChatGPT is a very helpful tool that offers a range of benefits, its limitations and ethical considerations cannot be overlooked. As with any powerful tool, it is essential to use ChatGPT responsibly.
