We all like music. If anybody was tempted to claim that he does not like music, it is probably because he hasn't had serious encounter with the type of music which interests him. In every way, it is a universal truth that music is almost as vital to us as our breath. Strangely, music which we enjoy on varied audio media such as radio or a recorder is so powerful as to change our behavior, moods and emotions.

When we listen to a song we like, we are definite to become rapidly absorbed by its lyrics and musical arrangement or perhaps the quality of the singer's voice. If a song you are enjoying was to stop abruptly, you might experience the shock of it as your heart beat drops. Not all people are magnetized by the same aspects of music. Someone may enjoy the melody with little attention to the lyrics and other features of a particular song.

Another may be taken up with how the rhythm guitar or lead guitar is played and how counter harmonies on the keyboard are played parallel to the main melody. Someone may enjoy the lyrics comparing the content with his own experiences. There are others who completely ignoring the music and vice, may concentrate on the literary properties of the phraseology employed in the song.

In whatever way, a song is an organized whole of the aspects. We may enjoy a particular feature (melody, instrumentals or voice) individually but music complete with all aspects is the perfect enjoyment. Above all, nobody can prescribe (forcefully) a type of music for your enjoyment. Any music which naturally appeals to your enjoyment is deemed to be your own perfect model of music.

Whether it is pop music, Reggae, Jazz, Rock or Hindustani classical music, what appeals to your personal taste is your own perfect music. However, it is far better if you have the capacity to appreciate certain hits by Michael Jackson, some by Jimm Reeves, some by Amaradeva, some by Kapuge, some by Victor Ratnayake or few hits by the Back Street Boys. Let's have a brief look at the therapeutic value of music. Most psychologists agree that a person's favourite music is a wonderful antidote to stress, depression and many other illnesses. It is proved that the pleasing qualities of music disguise a powerful medicinal effect.

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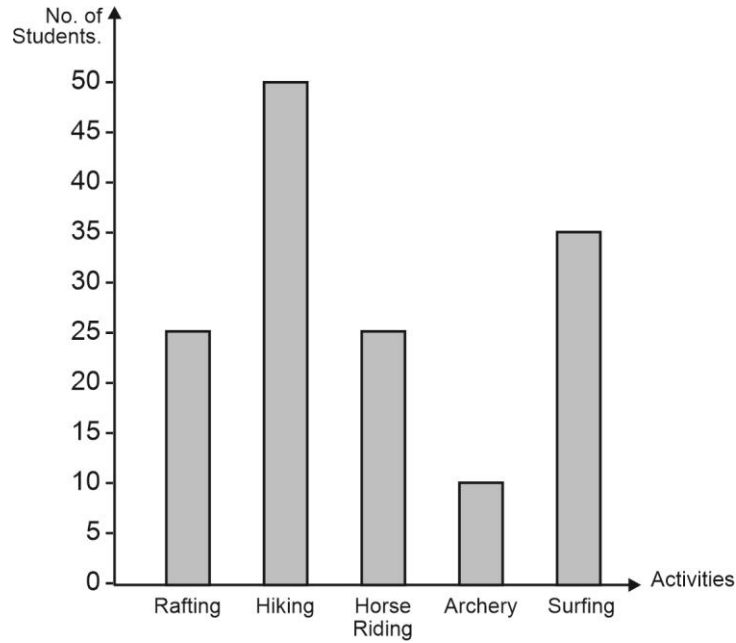
