





Sesame (Thala) is a crop that is grown for the oil in its seed. It is found in tropical and subtropical areas of Asia, Africa, and South America. Compared to similar crops, such as peanuts, soybean, and rapeseed, the seeds of sesame are believed to have the most oil. Sesame seeds are also rich sources of protein, vitamins, and antioxidants. Horton Plains is a national park in the central highlands of Sri Lanka that was designated in $\underline{1988}$. It is located at an elevation of $2,\underline{100}-2,\underline{300}$ m $(6,\underline{900}-7,\underline{500}$ ft). It is rich in bio-diversity and many species found here are endemic to the region. It is also a popular tourist destination and is situated 32 kilometres (20 mi) from Nuwara Eliya.

The Horton Plains are the headwaters of three major Sri Lankan rivers, the Mahaweli, Kelani, and Walawe. Stone tools dating back to Balangoda culture have been found here. 



The LifeStraw filter removes 99.9% of bacteria and 96.2% of viruses. It was initially created for those in emergency conditions and for people living in developing countries without enough fresh clean water.
