

Common Techniques of Marking Answer Scripts.

It is compulsory to adhere to the following standard method in marking answer scripts and entering marks into the mark sheets.

- 1. Use a red color ball point pen for marking. (Only Chief/Additional Chief Examiner may use a mauve color pen.)
- 2. Note down Examiner's Code Number and initials on the front page of each answer script.
- 3. Write off any numerals written wrong with a clear single line and authenticate the alterations with Examiner's initials.
- 4. Write down marks of each subsection in a A and write the final marks of each question as a rational number in a with the question number. Use the column assigned for Examiners to write down marks.



MCQ answer scripts: (Template)

- 1. Marking templets for G.C.E.(A/L) and GIT examination will be provided by the Department of Examinations itself. Marking examiners bear the responsibility of using correctly prepared and certified templates.
- 2. Then, check the answer scripts carefully. If there are more than one or no answers Marked to a certain question write off the options with a line. Sometimes candidates may have erased an option marked previously and selected another option. In such occasions, if the erasure is not clear write off those options too.

The Ten Commandments consist of commanding rules. Eg. Ex. 20:3; 13-18. In the Old Testament there were two kinds of rules: Commanding and traditional.

The commanding rules are generally negative, in second person and presents in singular form. Further, these are examples that in the verbal tradition, the Ten Commandments have taken a commanding nature.

2. <u>Negative rules</u>

Negative means "Not to do." There are 8 such rules in the book of Deuteronomy 5:7-21.

1. You shall not have any other God except me.

2. You shall not worship any images or statues or any treasure in the above or on earth.

3. You shall not take the name of God in vain.

4. You shall not kill.

5. You shall not commit adultery.

6. You shall not steal.

8. You shall not desire your neighbour's wife.

3. Positive rules

Positive means "Must do." In the book of Deuteronomy there are two rules of this kind. (Deut. 5:7-21)

- 1. You shall keep the Sabbath Holy
- 2. You must honour your father and mother as the Lord commanded
- 4. The rules which are compatible to all times
 - The Ten Commandments are valid for the past, present and future and are relevant to all generations.
- 5. It helps to build God Man relationship.

- God gave the Ten Commandments for us to lead a good life. The first three commandments deal with the relationship between God and man and the commandments from 4-10 deal with how to maintain the relationship of man with neighbour.

(ii) Explain using **five** commandments out of the ten, how you as a student would make use of them to live a life fostered with values.

"Do not steal." In this Commandment God invites us to act as school children, to act as persons of values, always thinking only of what belongs to us according to the will of God, without taking what belongs to others.

"Honour your father and mother." This Commandment invites us to give due

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honor them both in view of the hardships they endured in their parenthood. Accordingly, using these Ten Commandments, I will be able to live a life nourished by values. "Thou shalt not kill." By this God invites us to believe that the life of every human being is precious and that every human being is a creation of God. Therefore, I can apply this as a person of values by always cooperating with others in the love of God without destroying the life of human beings.

From the Commandment "Thou shall not lie," it always invites us to live a truthful life and always speak for the truth. By that as a person with values, I'll be able to be truthful every time by the help of the Ten Commandments.

By the Commandment "Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods," God invites me to desire the riches God has given me, and to continue living according to the talents God has always given me. That way we can use the Ten Commandments to live a life of values.

In such cases, resolving their conflicts in the love of Christian families can be seen as an active engagement of the Christian family in the Holy Church bound by love.

Various religious ceremonies held by Christian families in the Holy Church focuses on the actions of mercy based on love. Helping the poor in particular can be mentioned here. In such cases, Christian families actively contribute to the Holy Church out of love.

 - By the first sermon of St. Peter inspired by the Holy Spirit 3000 were converted to faith in Christ and joined the Church after repentance and Baptism.
 - By the coming of the Holy Spirit the Church began to spread day by day. (Give 5 marks for 5 points 5 marks for explanation)

- To treat everyone with fraternal love, deep faith and life witnessing.
- To take a lay leadership to work with all categories in collaboration and unity.
- To be peace makers and peace messengers and sacrifice for others without getting discouraged amidst of difficulties and hurt feelings.
- To depend always in the providence of God as a child of God avoiding all misconduct, having internal purity for the progress of the Church.
