





You could not possibly visit Paris without seeing the Eiffel Tower. Even if you do not want to visit the world famous structure, you will see its top from all over Paris. The tower rises 300 meters; when it was completed at the end of the 19 century it was twice as high as the Washington Monument, at the time the tallest structure in the world.

The Eiffel Tower, (nickname the iron lady) is a decorative iron lattice tower located on the Camp de Mars in Paris, built in 1889 as the entrance arch to the 1889 World's Fair, it has become both a global cultural icon of France and one of the most recognizable structures in the world. The tower is the tallest building in Paris and the most visited paid monument in the world; millions of people climb it every year. It is named after the engineer Gustave Eiffel, whose company designed and built the tower.

The tower has three levels for visitors. The tickets can be bought to climb the tower by stairs or lift, to the first and second levels. The walk from ground level to the first level is over 300 steps as is the walk from the first to the second level. The third and highest level is accessible only by the lift. Both first and second levels have restaurants.

The Eiffel Tower at night is one of the great sights of Paris and should not be missed. The gold lighting hightights the delicacy of the steelwork in a way that is missed in day light.
